### Principal Report: Denece Johnson

- 1. Update on Math tutor
  - Tutors hired for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade due to data from CBM.
- 2. Update on funds raised for technology
  - The funds raised by parents in response to letter from the administration were between \$3-4 thousand. It will be used to purchase laptops.
- 3. Mrs. Johnson presented the teacher reported responsibility chart. (Percentage of children turning in their homework on time)

Kindergarten went down 1%.

First grade went down 2%

Second grade went up 12%

Third grade went up 7%

Fourth grade went up 6% Fifth grade went down 3% Sixth grade went down 1%

Three of the 7 grades had increases. Average % of responsible students increased by 2%.

- 4. STEM prep class has been successful. All students have been exposed to the curriculum.
